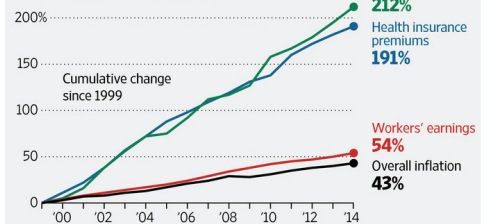
1 Lowers your company's health care costs by providing your employees a low-cost option for high-quality medical treatment.

RelyMD's program can save your company out-of-pocket healthcare costs and help mitigate the rising cost of health insurance premiums that you pay each year.

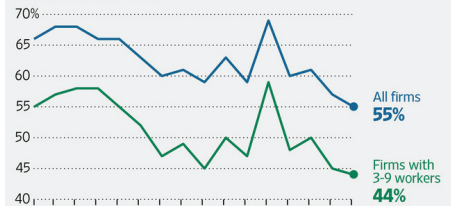
- There were over **136 million emergency room visits** in the U.S. last year.³ The N.E. Health Institute estimates that over half of these were not emergencies.⁴ In fact, nearly 1/3 of these visits occurred on the weekends, when most people's doctor's offices are closed.⁵
- On average, emergency room visits cost employers **well over \$1,000**. Even an urgent care visit averages \$140 to employers.⁶ By encouraging your employees to seek non-emergency care via RelyMD, **a much lower cost option**,

...while the share of firms offering health benefits has declined over time.

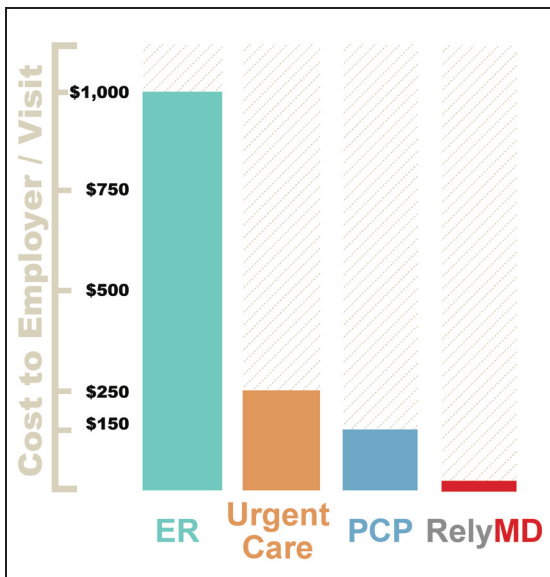

With RelyMD, when your employees get sick, they no longer have to waste time coordinating schedules, making appointments, then travelling to the doctor's office (time that is often absorbed by you, the employer, with late arrivals, early departures, or long lunches).
